

## The Monterey County Rape Crisis Center's Campus Advocate

is a confidential resource located at CSUMB in the Health & Wellness Building.

Support services are offered to students, faculty, and staff who have experienced or have been affected by sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic or intimate partner violence, and stalking.

The Campus Advocate is not a mandated reporter, which enables survivors to access services without infringing on their ability to make their own decisions.

Services are available regardless of when the incident happened and whether or not the survivor chooses to make a formal report to law enforcement or the Title IX Office.
