The Monterey County Rape Crisis Center provides diverse advocacy services to survivors of human trafficking of all ages.

An essential part of serving survivors is educating the community about how to identify and respond to human trafficking. MCRCC offers free training to nonprofits, social services organizations, religious communities, and businesses about human trafficking in our community and how to respond.

What is human trafficking?

Human trafficking is when a person is forced to work through force, fraud or coercion or when a minor is involved in commercial sex for any reason.

Human trafficking happens here and is a serious problem. People can be trafficked in different sectors - including commercial sex, agriculture, domestic work, and service work.

Is help available?

Monterey County Rape Crisis Center serves survivors of all forms of human trafficking. We provide advocacy, counseling, outreach and prevention services.
